# **DISCOVER ABILITY NETWORK**

**The challenge:** "When the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA) came into force we were getting a lot of questions from businesses that were interested in complying with the legislation but wanted some help and support on how to do that," says Louie Di Palma, Vice President, SME Programs at the Ontario Chamber of Commerce. "We worked with the province...[and] brought together half a dozen business associations, plus Magnet, and created the Discover Ability Network, which was created to provide businesses with the information they need to post jobs for, recruit, train, and retain persons with disabilities."

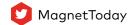

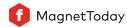

# **Magnet solution:**

# Connecting job seekers with disabilities to inclusive employers

Discover Ability Network (DAN) is powered by Magnet's job-matching technology, which connects employers to a candidate pool of qualified job seekers with disabilities.

"We're not just asking you to hire anybody," says Lisa Kelly, Programs Manager, Ontario Chamber of Commerce. "The tool matches job seekers to roles based on desire, location, skills, and qualifications."

The job matching tool also protects the confidentiality and privacy needs of users. Job seekers who are matched to an opportunity are invited to apply to the role; employers won't otherwise see a job seeker's application or information.

### The Results:

Since its launch in 2017, DAN has grown to include eight regional hubs and 52 landing pages. The platform boasts over 1,580 affiliated employers and 3,780 affiliated job seekers.

Our goal is to create awareness of the benefits to business of hiring this untapped talent pool, people with disabilities. It's our belief that once people become aware of it they understand, and see the value of hiring. Part of that is breaking down the myths, and part of that is sharing the business case.

Today, DAN offers a wide range of events, resources, and curated tools to help SMEs and large employers in Ontario better understand how to hire and retain people with disabilities. "We want to really share best practices through tools and storytelling and training on inclusivity," Kelly says.

The unique platform connects job seekers with disabilities to opportunities, but also offers free access to a variety of resources designed to help them gain and keep meaningful employment. DAN offers over 200 training sessions a year; the majority are designed for employers, job seekers, and community partners.

The tool is longitudinal. You can be on DAN for years and look for your next job on there, you're creating a profile that will evolve with you over time. And as your skills and talents develop, you might find another job opportunity that's better suited to you.

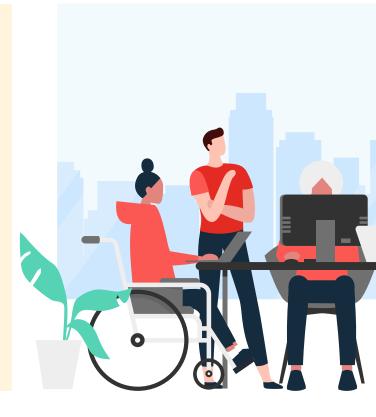
